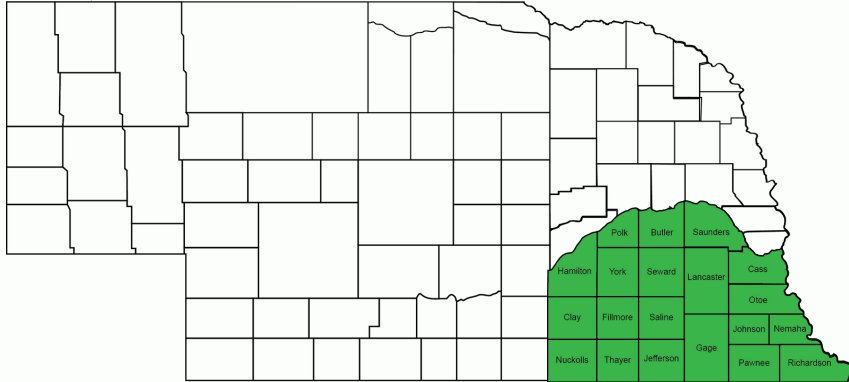




Southeast Nebraska Area Health Education Center (AHEC)

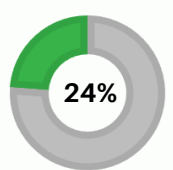

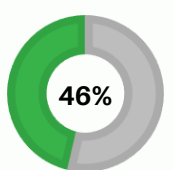
Health Career Pipeline Programs expose students to health careers through job shadowing, health career clubs, and more, developing intent to pursue post-secondary education in health professions programs.

Health Career Pipeline

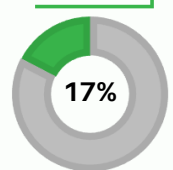

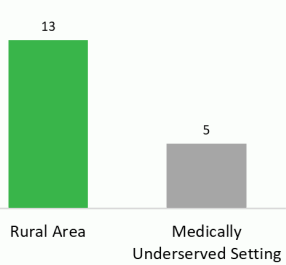

Clinical Training

2,460 clinical training rotation hours supported at 14 different locations

Encouraged health profession students to complete clinical training rotations in rural, medically underserved, and primary care locations. This is an evidence-based approach, resulting in students obtaining employment in these areas.



22 Nebraska AHEC Scholars

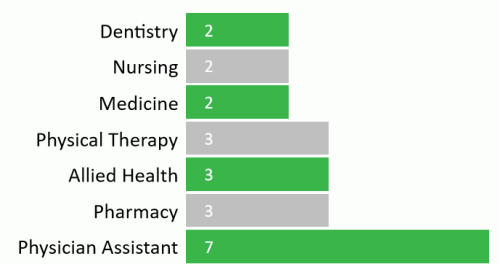
