### EMTL-1305 EMT-Emergency Medical Technician (Hybrid)

*Prerequisite: Must be at least 16 years of age*

This interactive course is designed to teach the foundational aspects of emergency medical care required for an EMT, including airway management, patient communication, trauma and medical patient assessment, and care for all sick and injured patient populations. 12-lead ECG placement, hazardous material awareness and major incident operations also will be discussed.

*At the successful conclusion of this course student will be eligible to sit for the National Registry Exam leading to EMT certification and state licensure. Lab is concurrent with lecture.*
